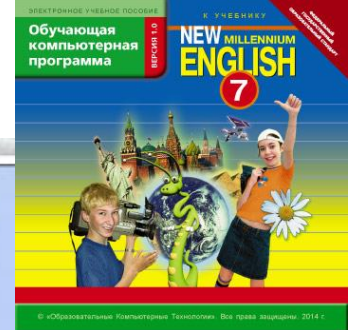

In July 2010, Russia faced the start of several hundred forest fires that broke out across the country, especially in its western part. The fires were probably caused by record temperatures and drought. The fires destroyed thousands of homes and 30% of the country's crop, ruined the environment and infrastructure of many villages and cities, and led to states of emergency in 35 regions of the country.

Actually, forest fires are not a very rare thing in Russia. But in 2010 the fires were burning in more populated areas and in places occupied by such kinds of trees which are very easily destroyed by fire. The level of air pollution rose high above the maximum permitted levels. There was also a risk of radioactive pollution, as the fires reached the regions of Russia situated not far from Chernobyl, the place where a nuclear power plant exploded in 1986.

The fires killed a lot of wildlife which lived in the forests and near them and changed the natural conditions of many regions, so that life there became almost impossible for those animals and birds who managed to survive. There is also a possibility that if the climate in Russia continues to become hotter, the areas damaged by fire will continue to be dry. This means that fires will attack these regions more often in the future, so the forests won't be able to grow back and the local wildlife will lose their natural home forever.

Business English for Young Adults

Do I need to take any exams in business English?	The more you understand your own needs before you start the course, the better your results will be. Try to think about the ways in which you'll have to use English in the workplace and practise using it in the lessons, and don't forget the vital importance of a positive frame of mind: people under stress do not usually make good language learners.
Is a business English course about special terminology?	It is not necessary to have previous business experience, but it is helpful if you have some. The main focus is teaching English through business-related topics, and on the English needed for business situations.
How can I get the best from a business English course?	Although the world of business is hugely diverse, the practical functions that people have to perform in their work are more or less the same. For example, many businessmen have to attend formal meetings, they need to interrupt (and to avoid interruption!) to explain, to approve, to make proposals, etc. A good business English course will also help the students to use English in everyday situations.
Do I need experience of business before I study business English?	You are going to learn specialist terminology in your own language first, and in this course you might not be clear about what terminology you will need in the future. But you are definitely going to learn more about using English in the real world and especially in common business situations.
What is a business English course?	People who are just going to start on a career in business can really benefit from this course. Such people need to study the world of business at the same time as they are learning the language – they are learning business in English, rather than English for business. Also, there are some people who are learning English without a clearly identified need, but just feel that it could be useful some time in the future.
Who needs a business English course?	You don't have to, but it might be a good idea, from the points of view of both motivation and qualifications. When you finish the course, there will be several possibilities, for example, BEC (Business English Certificate).

Remember that communication is a two-way street, so it's important to listen carefully to what your team mates are saying. If you distract them, or start planning ahead to what you are going to say next, you may miss an important detail, or repeat what has just been said by someone else, which is even worse.

If you feel confused by an idea, don't hesitate to ask about it. It's critical for everyone to understand what is going on, and if you are confused, others might also be. This should also work the other way. If you are asked questions, you should answer them politely. Your team mates may bring up a crucial detail you haven't thought of.

Everyone would agree that it's necessary to evaluate proposed ideas, but this should be done tactfully. Here are some tips to take into consideration before you criticise your team mates.

A team meeting does not have to be 100% business. It is perfectly acceptable to ask team members how they are doing, or what they are planning for next weekend. This can really help ease tension when disagreements occur later. Of course, you should not socialise for the entire meeting.

If you are having a bad day or are feeling unhappy with the team project, you could be giving off negative signals with body language or your tone. Even if you are saying the right thing, team members may still react negatively, if you send the wrong body language signals. If you are feeling tense before going into a meeting, try taking a deep breath to relax.

Of course, you would not want to make fun of your team mates or tell offensive jokes, but there are plenty of topics that your team mates may find humorous – some of them may even be project-related.

Although sometimes you know for sure your idea is the best, not everyone may understand it straight away. Your team mates may ask the same question several times. A member may forget a deadline unless reminded. Disagreements may occur over small details. Be patient, and in most cases things will work out.

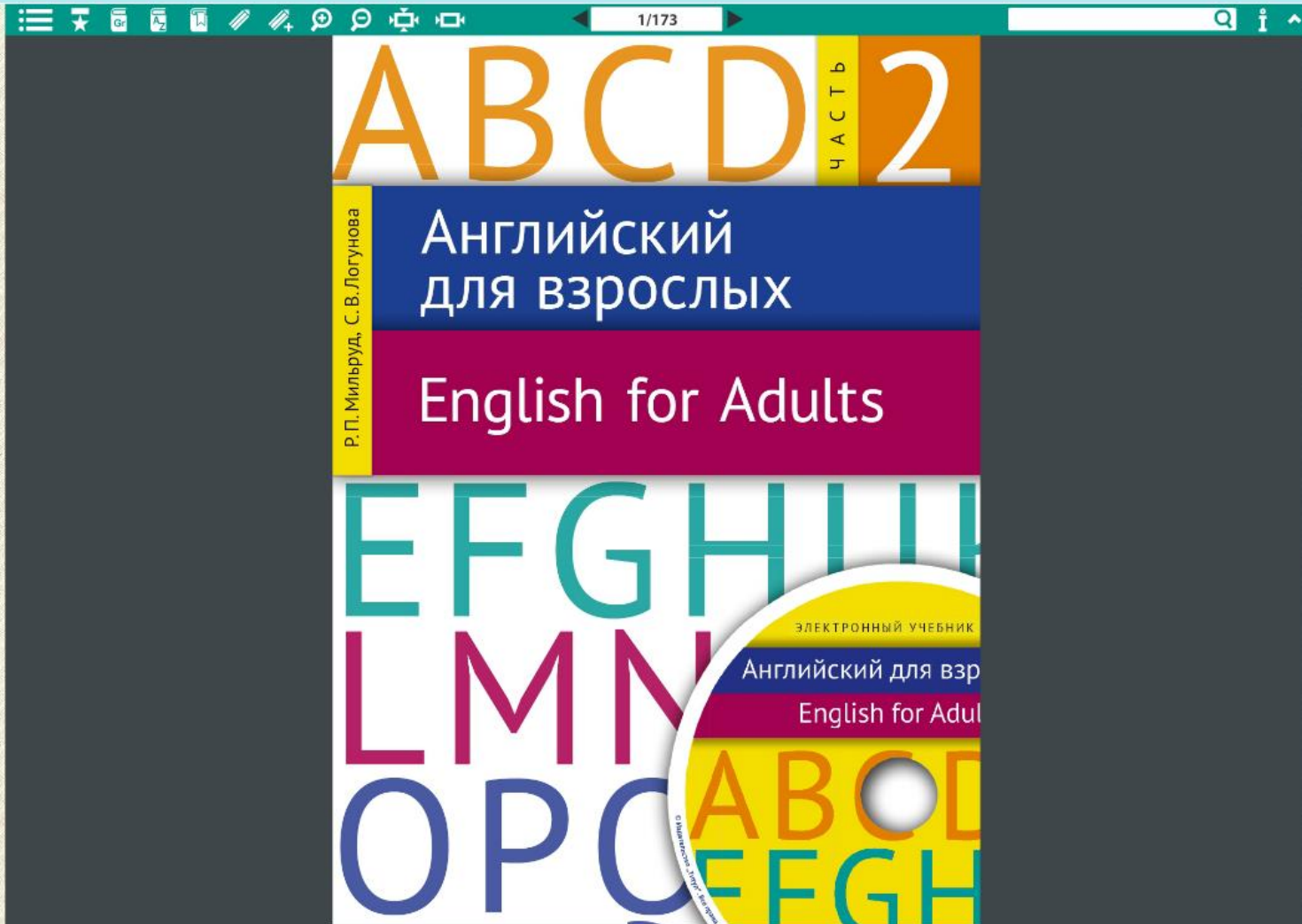

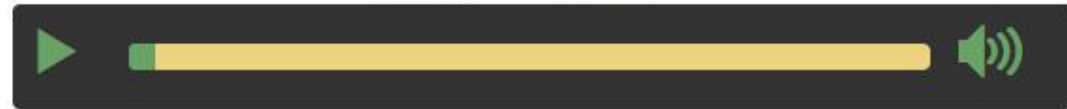

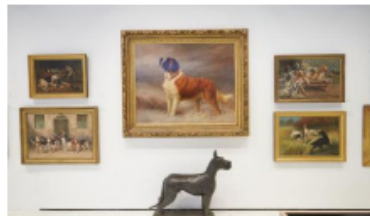

The museum is using its 200-item collection to put the dog/human and dog/art relationship in context. It just made its return to the

On May 6, 2019, just under a year after their [2018 fairytale wedding](#), Britain's Prince Harry and his wife Meghan Markle announced the birth of their first child — a healthy, 7-pounds, 3-ounce, baby boy. The news was first [revealed](#) on Prince Harry and Meghan Markle's Instagram and then on a [placard](#) placed at the entrance of Buckingham Palace by a pair of courtiers dressed in tails and red vests. Later in the day, a [beaming](#) Prince Harry informed reporters waiting outside the couple's Windsor Castle home that the "mother and baby are doing incredibly well." When asked what it felt like to be a dad, he gushed, "It's been the most amazing experience that I could ever possibly imagine."

Following the exciting announcement, royal fans both in the UK and Markle's home country, the United States, began to [speculate](#), and even wager, on what the child would be named. Since royal babies have traditionally been named after previous British monarchs, the most popular guesses for the first name ranged from Alexander to Spencer, James, Arthur, and Theodore. However, the Duke and Duchess of Sussex [shunned](#) the [custom](#) and instead went with Archie Harrison Mountbatten-Windsor.

- 4) Rabbits perform an athletic leap, known as a '**binky**', when they're happy – performing twists and kicks in mid air!
